Holy Trinity Church, West Hendred North Aisle roof – urgent work to the church starts 31st October

As has been widely publicised, urgent repairs to the North Aisle's supporting roof beams are needed. The structural engineer, following his inspection in late June 2022, gave his assessment that "In its current condition the roof is safe for continued use of the church provided the proposed repairs can be implemented within the next 6 months." He emphasised that we need to get the repairs done ASAP! We have received revised costs of £39,847 net to take into account inflation of building costs. We should be able to reclaim most of VAT. The PCC reviewed the entire costs, and its current funds, and decided that funds are now sufficient to proceed with the work. Just as the Newsletter goes to press, we have just had a pre-contract meeting with the architect and the contractor, Ward & Co. Work will begin on Monday 31st October, and is planned to be finished by 27th January. The whole of the north aisle, and pews north of the central aisle will be covered by plastic sheeting, as

well as scaffolding. From 31st October, access to the church on weekdays will be restricted by the contractor. We will be able to have services on Sundays. However, there will be only about half the pews available. The organ will be wrapped in plastic sheeting to protect it during the work, so we'll be using an electronic keyboard for services. We need your support. Thank you for the very generous donations from individuals. The total raised so far from grants and donations is £60,744 (including Gift Aid). Holy Trinity Church, West Hendred Oxford Historic Churches Ride and Stride – Saturday 10 September 2022

The weather was mostly good for this year's sponsored event – a slight shower or two, a light wind, and the sun shone! We're continuing to collect money from sponsors. We've had some additional sponsors as we go to press. The total so far received is £723.50, with quite a lot more to come in. I did Ride & Stride, with a slight improvement on last year, yet nowhere near the number of churches in 2017 and 2018. I wended my way from West Hendred, to East Hendred, and then via Steventon and Milton to Sutton Courtney then Abingdon. I bumped into Janice Spearing in St. Michaels, then I continued to Christchurch, and Peachcroft. Thence to Radley, and Janice Spearing arrived while I had part one of lunch. I continued to Sandford on Thames for part two of lunch, and then to Littlemore, Cowley, Iffley, and St. Albans on Charles Street off the Iffley Road, with its fascinating carvings by Eric Gill. I managed to visit St. Bartholomew's chapel, just up a lane off the Cowley Road, opposite the "Regal" cinema of old. It's a delightful chapel of the leper hospital founded by Henry I. I continued to St. Clements Church, through Mesopotamia to St. Cross, and round central Oxford, including St Mary Magdalen, Holyrood, and St Frideswide. Thence on St. Barnabas church in Jericho, with its glorious 19th Century mix of Ravenna and Torcello! I finished at the Greek Orthodox church in Canterbury Road. Such a great variety of churches in both style and setting. I clocked up 50 churches, exceeding my 2021 total by at least 10.

We would welcome all comments supporting the urgent need for the children's crossing to be created. We are aware that the crossing is not only unsafe for children but all villagers, particularly those with reduced mobility. Citizens Advice - Under pressure to use energy pre-payment meter?

Citizens Advice is expecting to see more cases of low-income families with energy supply debts being pressured into using pre-payment meters for their gas and electricity. Energy supplied by prepayment meters costs more than energy paid by direct debit or on-demand, at a time when increased price tariffs this autumn will probably see

most people's fuel bills double. Energy suppliers are legally obliged to negotiate repayment plans with customers who are falling behind on their bills, but many suppliers are ignoring this and proceeding with installing pre-payment meters or, for customers with smart meters, remotely switching them to prepayment.
