Holy Trinity West Hendred Oxford Historic Churches Ride and Stride

This year's sponsored event took place on Saturday 10th September.

The weather was mostly good – a slight shower or two, a light wind, and the sun shone! I opened Holy Trinity Church at just after 9-10 AM, with the first st/rider, Geoff Bailey, arriving shortly after from East Hendred, who then continued to Ardington and Wantage.

A total of at least 9 st/riders visited the church.

Janice Spearing cycled for Ride & Stride for the first time. She says "This was my first year of participation on Ride & Stride, a worthwhile fundraising event in aid of the Oxfordshire Historic Churches Trust, with half my sponsorship money going to West Hendred Church. I cycled from West Hendred to Radley and back, visiting 18 Churches. I received a warm welcome in those Churches which had hosts. It was an enjoyable yet exhausting day! Thank you to my generous sponsors."

The money raised will be divided equally between The Oxford Historic Churches Trust and Holy Trinity Church West Hendred. We usually receive our portion in late December or early January. OHCT have always been very supportive of us. In February 2021 they also awarded a grant of £7,000 towards the urgent repairs to the North Aisle roof supports.

Holy Trinity Church West Hendred North Aisle roof - Urgent work to the Church

As has been widely publicised, urgent repairs to the North Aisle's supporting roof beams are needed. The structural engineer, following his inspection in late June 2022, provided his assessment that "In its current condition the roof is safe for continued use of the church provided the proposed repairs can be implemented within the next 6 months." He emphasised that we need to get the repairs done ASAP! The bat specialist, determined in early August that we need a standard bat license, which he has applied for; we hope to receive in late October – a legal requirement before work commences. Our architect has been keeping the preferred contractor informed of events; the contractor says they can commence in early November, however they have revised the cost from

£32K net in May 2021, to £39,847 net to take into account inflation of building costs. We should be able to reclaim most of VAT. The PCC has reviewed the entire costs, and its current funds, and decided that these funds are now sufficient to proceed with the work, although the schedule will be tight. We need your support. Thank you for the very generous donations from individuals. The total raised so far from grants and donations is £60,744 (including gift aid). Warm Home Discount rules updated for 2022-23 — Citizens Advice

As winter approaches, many people will be nervously anticipating the cold

weather and its inevitable effect on their heating bills. The Warm Home Discount (WHD) was introduced by the government in 2011 to offset some of this burden.

For 2022-2023 there have been a couple of significant changes to the WHD: the number of energy suppliers participating in the scheme will increase, and those on disability benefits who don't have low incomes nor high energy costs will not receive the WHD. The value of the WHD payment is currently £150. Nobody needs to apply in order to receive it, with the exception of those living in mobile homes on a park home site (see below). The payment is credited automatically to the consumer's electricity supply account (or credit is directly applied to a prepayment meter), and energy suppliers have to make this payment by 31 March each year at the latest.

Eligibility for the WHD is ascertained by means of data-matching between energy suppliers and government departments. There are three eligible groups of consumers: low-income pensioner households; low-income people on some means-tested benefits; and households with high energy costs. This last criterion is determined by the type of property you live in, especially its age and its floor area (based on information supplied by the Valuation Office Agency or the Land Registry).

There is an alternative form of WHD for those living in mobile homes on park home sites. For more information about this, visit www.gov.uk and search for "Warm Home Discount".
