Holy Trinity West Hendred Oxford Historic Churches Ride and Stride – 10th September

This year's sponsored event is on Saturday 10th September – money raised will be divided equally between The Oxford Historic Churches Trust and Holy Trinity Church West Hendred. Oxford Historic Churches Trust will, like last year, have R+S with somewhat different arrangements - which will be confirmed nearer the time.

Potential participants are asked to keep the date available – Saturday 10th September. There is anticipated to be very limited printed material distributed, with almost everything available online from OHCT's website.

Last year's final total raised was £805. Holy Trinity Church received half of sponsorship, which was £402-50; a really good total, especially given these Covid times.

In August 2020 OHCT awarded a grant of £1,000 towards the replacement, due to death watch beetle and timber rot, of a defective Bell Tower wall plate along the south side of the bell chamber. The work was completed in September, with a total cost of £4,196 net. In February 2021 OHCT awarded a grant of £7,000 towards the urgent repairs to the North Aisle roof supports, where the total cost is £62,000.

Holy Trinity Church West Hendred North Aisle roof – supporting timbers – Urgent work to the church

As has been widely publicised, urgent repairs to the North Aisle's supporting roof beams are needed. The architect has received the tender responses; this gives us a building cost with VAT of £39,000. With the professional fees for the architect and structural engineer, and contingency this gives a total of £62,000. As the church has several species of bats which are protected by law, this affects when the repair work can be done. The bat specialist, Colin Menendez, visited again in late June and reported:

"The bat surveys on the church finished with a dawn survey this week. The church has been quite quiet bat-wise this month. Common pipistrelle are still present, and this morning we searched for and found a long-eared bat tucked in the roof timbers. Also at the crack of dawn a barn owl came and sat on a tombstone to watch what was going on, and then flew into the adjacent field to hunt. The next task is to work out how to undertake the repairs to the church in tandem with the bats. The bat droppings collected have been packaged-up to send for DNA analysis, which usually takes about 10 days. This will confirm our final tally of species, and whether a low impact licence can be used or a standard licence."

A bat was found bat found in the roof-timber mortice hole, photographed using an endoscope. A low impact license would enable the work to commence sooner, but a standard license would need to await Natural England, which could take 60 days. The roof beams were checked a further time for safety in late June by the Structural Engineer; we are to get the repairs done soonest.

Hopefully the repairs will start in late summer or autumn. There will be further reports as things move forward.

Study scammers' ways and beat them — Citizens Advice

Much as we hate them, we must concede that today's scammers are thoroughly up to date and quick off the mark. In very recent months scammers have pretended to be energy companies offering great deals; local councils speeding up Council Tax rebates; and government departments tendering financial support— each attempt closely following on the heels of breaking news and timed to exploit any sign of vulnerability or need.

Be on your guard generally. To help you defend yourself, here are a few things which should ring alarm bells:

Someone you don't know contacts you unexpectedly.

An entity that you normally deal with contacts you in an unusual way (for instance, DVLA emailing you when it has never done so before – this actually happened in one scam)

A telephone caller asks for you by your last name, mumbles the name of his business and adds "how are you?" (watch out for callers who end every phrase with a question) If you think that you have been tricked (or if you

simply want to report an attempted scam), contact your bank right away to stop any payments, change your computer log-in details if appropriate, and report the scam to Action Fraud on 0300 123 2040. You can also use their online reporting tool at

https://www.actionfraud.police.uk

Action Fraud can sign you up for email alerts so you will know what scams are on the way. And lastly, they can also give you a useful crime reference number. Another source of help is the National Trading Standards scams team: their website has lots of useful information. Citizens Advice can help, and our advice is free and impartial. For online scams you can talk to our specialist scams action advisers on 0808 250-5050, or by webchat; or you can call our Consumer Service on 0808 223-1133; or visit www.citizensadvice.org.uk for more information.
