Holy Trinity West Hendred Oxford Historic Churches Ride and Stride

This year's sponsored event took place on Saturday 11^{th} September. The weather was good – dry, with a light wind, and the sun shone! The total so far is over £330, with quite a lot more to come in.

I did Ride & Stride, with a slight improvement on last year. I wended my way from West Hendred, to East Hendred, and then via Steventon to Sutton Courtney then Abingdon. Thence via Radley and Sandford on Thames, to Littlemore, Cowley, and Iffley. I squeezed in a visit to St. Albans on Charles Street off the Iffley road, with sufficient time to have a good look at its stations of the cross carved by Eric Gill. I managed to visit St. Bartholomew's chapel, just up a lane off the Cowley Road, opposite the "Regal" cinema of old. It's a delightful chapel of the leper hospital founded by Henry I. Then on to St. Clements Church, and then through Mesopotamia to St. Cross, and round central Oxford, finishing at St. Barnabas church in Jericho, with its glorious 19th Century mix of Ravenna and Torcello!

I clocked up 39 churches, and at least 5 more that I visited hoping they were participating, and they were not! Anyway, near ideal weather for the bike ride, and I finished with 2 hours remaining in central Oxford.

Update on the North Aisle Roof at Holy Trinity Church

The excellent news as the Newsletter went to press was that we've received a grant from the National Churches Trust of £3,700 and an additional £5,000 grant from the Wolfson Foundation.

We've also had some very generous individual donations which total £10,870, (£12,944 with Gift Aid). In mid-September we had received grants totalling £20,500 from various charitable foundations.

The total raised so far from all sources is £58,144 (including gift aid) – so we're almost there (total cost of £62,000). In addition, we can reclaim some, but not all of the VAT, as this depends upon when the money is spent.

The PCC has now appointed the preferred building contractor, with provisos recommended by the architect. Also, the roof beams are being checked again for safety in early November by the Structural Engineer.

Citizens Advice information on vanishing energy suppliers

Many people have recently had the disconcerting experience of seeing their energy supplier break up and go out of business during the recent energy price fluctuations. It sounds pretty drastic, but the situation isn't as bad as it seems.

If you are one of those affected, remember these key facts: first of all, the gas or electricity supply itself won't be interrupted, so don't be concerned about that. Next, you should know that Ofgem, the

industry regulator, will automatically move you to a new supplier. This usually takes a few weeks. Wait for your new supplier to contact you. They will explain what will happen with your new account. But contact the new supplier yourself if you haven't heard from them within two weeks. You can check on www.citizensadvice.org.uk ("check who's taken over your energy supply") if you're not sure who your new supplier is.

While you're waiting to hear from the new supplier, it's a good idea to take meter readings (and a photo of the readings) as they might prove useful later. Make a note of your account balance too. Keep any old bills you have, as these can help prove your payment history, credit balance or debt.

If you aren't happy with your new supplier or tariff, you can switch suppliers. Look at "switch energy supplier" on our website or ring the Citizens Advice Consumer Helpline on 0808 223 1133.

Many people are seeing their energy bills increase significantly. If you are one of them, and worried about being able to meet these higher energy payments, please contact Citizens Advice on our Adviceline number 0808 278 7907.
