Holy Trinity West Hendred Oxford Historic Churches Ride and Stride 11th September

This year's sponsored event is on Saturday 11th September – money raised will be divided

equally between The Oxford Historic Churches Trust and Holy Trinity Church West Hendred. Oxford Historic Churches Trust will, like last year, have R+S with somewhat different arrangements to previous years. OHCT are building on what they learnt from last year. They consider that much can be achieved in a simpler way, and so they will be using a similar approach to last year. The list of participating churches will be on OHCT's website and be updated as the day approaches. Participants are asked to keep the date available - Saturday 11th September. There will be very limited printed material distributed, with almost everything available online from OHCT's website. Sponsorship forms will be available in Holy Trinity Church. Last year's final total raised was £848-50. Holy Trinity Church received half of sponsorship, which was £424-25; this was raised by 9 St/riders and well over 30 sponsorships, more than 100 church visits. In August 2020 OHCT awarded a grant of £1,000 towards replacement of a wall plate along the south side of the Tower bell chamber which had failed due to death watch beetle, and timber rot. The work was completed in September, with a total cost of £4,196 net. In February OHCT awarded a grant of £7,000 towards the urgent repairs to the North Aisle roof supports, where the total cost is expected to be about £62,000. Holy Trinity Church West Hendred North Aisle roof – supporting timbers – URGENT WORK TO THE CHURCH

In February's Newsletter, we provided the background to the urgent repairs to the North Aisle's supporting roof beams. The Church's architect and the structural engineer provided a budgetary estimate and outline repair scheme in early January. They have devised an approach that does not require the North Aisle roof to be removed (which would have required external scaffolding).

The architect has received the tender responses from 3 building contractors; this gives us a building cost with VAT of £39,000. Fortunately, we should be able to reclaim most of the VAT. With the professional fees for the architect and structural engineer, and contingency this gives a total of £62,000.

We need your support

We've had a number of very generous donations from individuals which now total £10,080, (£12,096 with Gift Aid). We have also received grants totalling £15,500 from various charitable foundations.

As we go to press, we are awaiting the outcome of grant applications to the Garfield Weston Foundation and the National Churches Trust and hope to hear from them in mid-July to mid-August. Regrettably the Doris Field Charitable Trust has not provided a grant. However, we are in the process of applying to further potential funders.

The total raised so far from all sources is £43,596 (including gift aid) –we're just over two-thirds of the way to achieving our target. Other funders want to see significant funding from the local community before making grants. Grab A Jab

The vaccination of all adults over the age of 18 continues. Walk-in clinics in Oxford have delivered over 800 first dose COVID-19 vaccinations to people aged 18 or over as part of the 'grab a jab' weekend (26/27 June). To date, over 765,500 COVID-19 vaccinations have been delivered in Oxfordshire since the start of the programme.

More walk-in clinics will be available to those aged 18 or over for first dose vaccines: Iffley Road Sports Centre, Acer Nethercott Hall, Iffley Rd, Cowley, Oxford OX4 1EQ, Tuesday 6 July - Friday 9 July, 9.30am to 7.30pm. The last entry is at 7pm apart from Friday 9 July which closes at 6pm, last entry at 5.30pm. Enter via pedestrian walkway from Iffley Road, not from Jackdaw Lane. East Oxford Health Centre, Manzil Way, Cowley OX4 1GE on Saturday 10 July, 9am-5pm. All the latest on walk-in clinics can be found at oxfordshireccg.nhs.uk

No appointment is necessary, and no proof of identity is required (although helpful) to allow people aged 18 or over to 'grab a jab.'
People who attend a walk-in clinic for their first dose will have their vaccination record updated online and will then be able to book in their second dose appointment using the national booking system.

If you are aged 18 or over, you can also book a vaccination on the national booking service (people do not need to wait to be invited). Get Tested:Further call for 18-29 year olds to get tested as cases in Oxford now highest in the south-east. Additional COVID-19 testing facilities for people aged 18 - 29 in Oxford will continue to be available after cases in the city jumped from 296 to 946 this week (ending 2 July), with 80 per cent falling in this age group.

More than a thousand young people took part in PCR testing at temporary facilities over the weekend. Oxfordshire County Council and Oxford City Council is asking for more people aged 18 - 29 to now take part with three walkin mobile testing units open for business from Tuesday 6 July - Sunday 11 July, 10am - 8pm (no appointment is needed):

Following advice, four in five people are able to resolve their problem and we help most to find a way forward. We also use evidence to influence policies and practices that affect people's lives. Our **145** volunteer advisers and 15 FTE staff advise about 10,000 people each year from 4 Advice Centres. Since March, our staff and volunteers have been operating our Adviceline service from home.

We are members of National Citizens Advice, which means we have access to its services, resources and support and it sets and audits our advice standards. However, as an independent charity, we are responsible for running our own affairs and much of our funding comes from District, Town and Parish Councils and local charities.

Trustees are asked to attend 6 Board meetings a year, held in the evening at various locations (although remotely for the moment). Each Trustee is encouraged to take an interest in a particular aspect of the charity's work. Curly Cottage Sewage Connection

We wanted to let you know about an upcoming aspect of our building project that will unfortunately have an impact on you. We are, after 15 years of struggling with a very old and decrepit septic tank, connecting Curly Cottage to mains drainage.

Unfortunately, this means that we need to dig up the road to make the mains connection. All necessary applications and licences have been secured by our contractors Gorman Construction. We are also aware that members of the village have contacted the Council about these works as they are concerned about the adjacent Yew Tree. We wanted to confirm and hopefully reassure you that we have secured specific permission from the Vale of The White Horse planning department for the delicate task of digging a trench for a pipe adjacent to the wall. This trench will be dug by hand to avoid roots. We have had no control over when the council decided the work should be done and it has now been scheduled for the week commencing the 9th August.

A diversion through Ginge will be in place for the duration of the works, which could take up to 5 days. The duration is due to the heavy traffic that uses the road; our contractor is liable for the work for an extended period and they have to be sure their surface is capable of carrying the load. Rest assured if it can be done more quickly it will be. We want to apologise for this inconvenience and we hope you understand this work is important for us. If anything changes we will let you know as soon as we hear. If anyone has any further queries please do not hesitate to contact us directly.

Covid-19 As we go to press, we have had the government's mid-July announcement. We are awaiting further updated Government Guidance from ACRE, as are our hirers, of what is permitted and how, in the coming weeks. We have been working through Government Guidance, and guidance from ACRE (Action with Communities in Rural England) with revisions / updates on opening the hall. This is for specified uses by hirers.

Village Hall becoming a Charitable Incorporated Organisation (CIO)

We mentioned in January that we had applied to the Charity Commission for the Hall to become a Charitable Incorporated Organisation (CIO), which the Charity Commission has approved. This is so that the hall's Trustees will no longer have unlimited financial liability. We have in the last few days had a new bank account set up—all a lot slower than in non-Covid times.

We have been transferring the assets of the original charity to the new CIO. We are working with our auditor so that we transfer our various contracts and arrangement to the CIO. After this is all done, the original charity will be wound up.
