YELLOW HOUSEHOLD FORMS

In the coming days, staff from South Oxfordshire and Vale of White Horse District Councils will be visiting homes whose occupants have not updated their details following requests via the yellow 'Household Enquiry' form. The council needs this information to make sure everyone who is eligible to vote is able to do so in forthcoming elections.

In August the two councils sent yellow letters to all homes across the two districts requiring people to confirm who currently lives in their property. They then issued reminders in September. All households that did not respond by 5 October will now receive a visit from a council officer to confirm their details.

All staff making the household visits will be carrying ID so if someone knocks on your door please feel free to ask to see their ID before answering any questions. Residents can still avoid receiving a visit by confirming or updating their details immediately at householdresponse.com/southandvale <<u>http://www.householdresponse.com/southandval</u> e>. You will need the 2-part code on the yellow

 $\underline{e>}$. You will need the 2-part code on the yellow letter or reminder to do this.

<u>Important – by law, each household must confirm</u> <u>their details, even if they are correct.</u> Anyone who fails to do so could be fined up to £1,000.

Residents who do not have access to the internet can confirm their details by completing and returning the form that comes with the letter. If your details are correct you can also confirm this by phone or text – the details required for this are included on the yellow letter.

The poppy appeal is now in full swing and your support is much appreciated.

What is Remembrance?

Remembrance honours those who serve to defend our freedoms and way of life. We will remember them. We remember the sacrifice of the Armed Forces community from Britain and the Commonwealth. We pay tribute to the special contribution of families and of the emergency services. We acknowledge innocent civilians who have lost their lives in conflict and acts of terrorism.

Remembrance does not glorify war and its symbol, the red poppy, is a sign of both Remembrance and hope for a peaceful future. Wearing a poppy is never compulsory but is greatly appreciated by those who it is intended to support. When and how you choose to wear a poppy is a reflection of your individual experiences and personal memories. Remembrance unites people of all faiths, cultures, and backgrounds but it is also deeply personal. Th Act of Remembrance could mean wearing a poppy in November, before Remembrance Sunday. It could mean joining with others in your community on a commemorative anniversary. Or it could mean taking a moment on your own to pause and reflect. Everyone is free to remember in their own way, or to choose not to remember at all.

In every act of remembrance, we honour the memory of the fallen and pledge to care for the living. We will remember them.

THE SCHOOLREADERS NETWORK

The Schoolreaders network match volunteers to schools who need people to listen to children read in local Primary Schools. These children often have very little one on one time with an adult either at home or at school and their reading and confidence suffers. Once they leave Primary School, there is no provision in the curriculum to work on basic literacy and children who don't read to the required standard are unable to access their secondary education.

They have a number of partner schools in this part of Oxfordshire and if anyone feel they have a little time each week, they can be matched to local children where they can make a real difference to children's lives. NEIGHBOURHOOD POLICING REPORT

Sunday 6th October to Sunday 13th October saw a national operation to target rural crime. The South & Vale Police area ran a week long operation as part of this, which included high visibility patrols, especially at 'hotspot' areas, visits to farms and rural businesses with enforcement of any offences. This included partnership working with Council enforcement Officers to target fly tipping.

Burglary remains a force priority. The Wantage & Faringdon Team have assisted with enguiries following some recent burglaries in this area, including one in Ardington on 2nd October. There was a burglary on the road between Reading Road and Ardington Lane. The incident took place between midnight and 7.33am on 2nd October after offenders gained access to a secure container at the property. A Honda guad bike was stolen. A vehicle which was blocking the door to the container had been broken into and moved by releasing the handbrake. The Ref number is 43190304500. CITIZENS ADVICE ENERGY ADVICE DRIVE

Our local Citizens Advice is launching its annual initiative to help people in financial need who find it hard to pay their energy bills. The project, called the Energy Advice Programme (EAP), is live now throughout Oxfordshire South and Vale and includes comprehensive steps to help people who have to spend a significant proportion of their income on fuel bills. At an EAP appointment our advisers, depending on your particular problem, can help you understand energy companies' tariffs and bills; provide information and support on switching tariff or supplier; give advice on energy efficiency measures and list any grants available to pay or these; carry out benefit entitlement checks. They can also help you apply for the Warm Home Discount and the Priority Services Register, if applicable. The Citizens Advice website www.citizensadvice.org.uk will give you more information.
