Holy Trinity Church West Hendred Oxford Historic Churches Ride and Stride

This year's sponsored event took place on Saturday 9th September. 31 st/riders visited the church on a pleasant late summers day.

We now have the phenomenal final total of $\pounds 1020$. This significantly exceeds 2016's grand total of £867-35. Holy Trinity Church receives half of sponsorship, which is £510; this was raised by 5 St/riders and 47 sponsorships, with 106 church visits.

This is a fantastic total! The last time the total exceeded £1,000 was in 2013. Over the last 5 years, West Hendred raised £4,554, and over the last 10 years £9,818. Our participation in Ride & Stride greatly helped our grant application to OHCT in March 2017 towards the cost of the church's lead roof alarm & monitoring system.

Thank you to all who took part - Hannah and Julian Taylor, Roy Lennox, Sally and Tim Hutchinson, as well as Hugh Rees. Thank you also to those who welcomed St/riders to Holy Trinity Church. Finally, a BIG THANK YOU to all who sponsored!

WASTE COLLECTION DATES

The collection due on Tuesday 2nd January will now take place on Thursday 4th January – this is for the grey bin and food waste. The collection due on Tuesday 9th January will now take place on Wednesday 10th January – this is for the green bin, food waste and garden waste.

A message from a resident living on The Greenway:

Dear Newsletter Readers,

I feel compelled to mention what I witnessed in it's entirety from my bedroom window on the morning of 7th December, as it left me feeling incredulous at the idiocy of some people, and far more importantly, the potentially serious result which may have ensued.

My daughter, who only passed her driving test in August and has already had the confidence shattering experience of having an accident when pulling out of the top of the Greenway onto the incredibly busy and hazardous A417 at peak time in the morning, was, once again, at the top of the road waiting to turn right onto the A417. The traffic was very busy as usual and there was no opportunity for her to pull out, as is often the case, and one has to be patient and wait, which is exactly what she was doing. Suddenly, up behind her comes a motorist from in the village who was clearly impatient and was nosing closer and closer up to the back of my daughter's car. Already I was starting to feel anxious for my daughter when then, this motorist goes into reverse (fortunately the vehicle behind it was a considerate and comfortable distance back), and pulls up alongside my daughter's car on her right-hand side, so effectively is in the lane of any traffic which may be wishing to turn in to the Greenway from the main road. And then, to demonstrate the point, shoots across the main road between oncoming cars and heads off towards Rowstock, I understand you have to grab the opportunity to

get across the A417 in the morning/evening at peak times as it is very busy and that a more experienced driver is often more willing to "take a risk" in so doing. None the less, a less experienced one has every right to be nervous and more cautious, especially in view of recent events, I was observing the busyness of the road and I felt it was one of those situations, as sometimes happens, where there simply wasn't an opportunity to "take a chance and go for it", so to speak.

I appreciate the motorist concerned would be unaware of my daughter's situation, but, please, how can you consider yourself a safe and considerate driver?! What was done here was illegal and had the potential to cause an accident. I was very tempted to call the Police or the Highways Agency and report the individual. Please can we have more considerate driving. Living where we do, we have seen far too many accidents at the top of the Greenway over the years and what I witnessed that morning was outrageous and only likely to lead to more.

We've had a really exciting year. We've welcomed **Chantal Ligertwood** as our Secretary.

The big events have been the hosting the **West Hendred Not Just a Beer Festival** in June.

WHNJABF provided a generous donation to the Kitchen, also a big thank you to West Hendred Parish Council, and also YOU the village residents. We received grants from Awards for All England, the small grant division of the Big Lottery Fund, the Doris Field Charitable Trust, as well as from the Magnox Socio-Economic Fund. A really big thank you goes to Dan Bashford for his invaluable help on the grant applications, especially to the key funder, Awards for All. The New Kitchen and the ideas have evolved and adapted over the years, so we really appreciate your patience while we reached such a fantastic result! The Village Hall now has professional-grade catering facilities, and are able to offer more versatile menus for larger groups. A big *Thank You* goes to Oli Barton and her professional expertise – this really came to the fore in responding to Awards for All questions – the grant was awarded in less than 8 weeks, as opposed to the usual 4 months! The Kitchen was installed ahead of schedule and within budget; it was publicised in the Wantage Herald and Oxford Times.

Over the summer and early autumn, we spruced up our electrics, which we needed to do for our new Kitchen. Thank you to all who worked on and supported this unglamorous necessity.

On 25th November, it was the **OFFICIAL GRAND OPENING** of the **Village Hall's new Kitchen**. We celebrated & showed off the new Kitchen and had the arduous duty of eating delicious mince pies, and supping mulled wine. One Mince pie was not enough!

We kicked off 2017 with **JAZZ IN THE VILLAGE**. Ian Millar (Saxaphone) and Dominic Spencer (Piano) delighted us with melodic jazz, with improvisations.
