#### **District Councillor Update**

Why so many power cuts and should we expect better? We get power cuts pretty frequently in this ward, and in other rural parts of the district. I feel we should be getting a better service from our local network operator Scottish and Southern Electricity Networks (SSEN). Power cuts are at best a major inconvenience and for vulnerable groups they can be dangerous. Most central heating will not work when the electricity is out, no matter what the fuel is, and this is a particular risk for the old and young and those with health conditions. If you have any records of when

recent power cuts have affected you, for example how many cuts there have been, when they were and how long they lasted, or the impacts they caused, please do drop me an email. This is something I am going to be following up with SSEN.

Vale of White Horse Green Group is calling for a public inquiry into Thames Water's plans for the SESRO (South East Strategic Reservoir Option) reservoir

Here in the Green Party Group of councillors on the Vale we are very concerned about Thames Water's plans for a 1.5 million cubic metre reservoir in our area. This is one and a half times larger than the reservoir Thames Water consulted on in drawing up their draft Water Resource Management Plan last year. There are significant concerns about flooding risk, safety and biodiversity that remain unanswered, even though the plan for a large reservoir in this location is something Thames Water have been pushing for decades now. A recent briefing for councillors revealed that very recent groundwater modelling carried out on behalf of Thames Water shows a predicted increase in groundwater levels of 1m due to the reservoir at its southern side. It is concerning that this is only coming to light now as local residents have been asking about issues like this for years. As a result, Vale of White Horse Green Group is backing Group Against Reservoir Development's (GARD) call for a public inquiry into the reservoir plans. We have written to the Secretary of State to ask him to exercise his powers to call a public inquiry at this stage.

# Holy Trinity Church West Hendred Heating Update

As mentioned in previous newsletters, we're making much needed improvements to the church's heating. After careful research into the alternatives, the Parochial Church Council have decided to move ahead with a new system of under-pew heaters. The electrical contractors we are planning to use – Electric Heating Solutions, who specialise in church heating – have quoted £12,900 excl. VAT for the installation (the church should be able to claim back all the VAT).

We've been agreeing with the Diocese and EHS the precise cable runs, so that the medieval encaustic tiles are not affected. These tiles are a big aspect of the church being Grade One listed. As we go to press, the Diocese have said they are giving permission subject to a revised diagram of the cable-runs from EHS before work commences.

Heating is our church's biggest running cost. Based on the experience of similar churches at Denchworth and Childrey, these heaters will be not only more effective at keeping the congregation warm but will also cost considerably less to run! We need to raise a further £5,000 to close our funding gap. Thank you for the very generous donations from individuals.
